

### From the Theme Leader, Rev Alistair Smeaton

*Follow my Leader* - Following, learning and leading in the life of the Kingdom of God. During the week we will be thinking about various aspects of being a disciple. The titles for each of the five days will be: Called to faith, Called to learn, Called to follow, Called to work together and Called to take the lead. Each day we will be drawing on stories from both the Old and the New Testament. We will be seeking insights from the story of Christianity across the centuries and I will be offering glimpses of some of the things that are going on within the Christian Church in Cumbria. I don't plan to do all the talking so please come prepared to share as well as to listen: but I have no intention of putting anyone on the spot.

### From the Worship Leader, Rev Tony Lee

The worship will reflect the theme of this year's Forum. We will marvel and give thanks to our Father God for his involvement in our lives. We will remind one another of the steps we take as we walk with him through life. We will Step Forward, Step Out, Step Over, Step Up, Step Into and Step Down... Mind how you tread?!

### <u>Workshops</u>

### Discussion (Roger Buxton)

Do you have any words or sayings that help you through your day? Certainly I do. Such as *Love God and do what you like, Let go and Let God* and how about *Do your best and leave the rest*? All easy to say but not so easy to do! I think we can have an enjoyable and thought provoking time reflecting on our inspirations, whatever they may be. As the great Irish actor and theatrical director Sir Tyrone Guthrie, who faced many problems, was heard to say: 'Rise above it'!

### Bible Study (Julie McLaren)

This group will follow the theme talks during the week and re-visit bible passages that Alistair uses. We will explore other passages related to the theme and see how the Bible speaks to us today. Our own experiences from a variety of situations will help us to clarify our thoughts. You will need to bring a Bible with you and perhaps a notebook to jot down references that seem useful to you. Above all come to exchange thoughts and ideas and be prepared to change your mind.

### Choir (Cathryn Rogers)

The aim of the week is to have fun, sing a few songs and enjoy ourselves. During the week we'll learn any new hymns or songs for worship the next day, and tackle an assorted chamber repertoire in a wide variety of styles, and from many different periods of composition. It's literally Gabrieli to Gershwin! Of course there may be a little Rutter during the week, and we'll also look at some of the recently published choral music of the Salvation Army.

### Film Group - Marion Turner

The first film is *Hunt for the Wilderpeople*, a 2016 film from New Zealand. The Guardian review states 'this is a big-hearted film full of small, understated moments of magic - full of off-kilter charm' but it will raise points for discussion. The second film may be *The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas* but this could change. The third is British comedy at its best - *The Happiest Days of Your Life*. Come along and join our discussion and debate or just sit and enjoy three very different films.

### Photography - Fred Davies

Whether you are an experienced photographer or new to photography, this workshop could be for you. All you need is a digital camera. Throughout the week we will be taking photographs at the Hayes and hope to present an audio-visual presentation on the final evening which will include photographs from all members of the group.

### Needlework – Alison Foxwell

The needlework group this year will be following the theme with the cross stitch pattern of an individual following God's command.

All are welcome to have a go at the pattern or continue with your own stitching work, knitting or just relaxing with friends.

I will provide fabric, threads and needles so all you need to bring are sharp scissors and glasses (if you need them).

### Young People's Group - Tim Lee & Meg Wilson

This group is for older-teenagers/young adults who are perhaps too old for the children's groups, but don't yet want to join in with the theme talk and the after coffee workshops. The group will be very fluid, so that anyone can choose to attend the theme talk before coffee on some days and join this group on other days. Various activities are planned for each day including drama, crafts and possibly outdoor activities. We also aim to spend time on the overall theme by looking at Bible passages and discussing how we might apply what we learn in today's world and in our own lives. We may also create a contribution for the Forum Evening.

### Children's Workshops – Carol & Douglas Fleming (Co-ordinators) & Others

Before morning coffee (during the theme talks) there will be children's groups as follows: Crèche for the 0-4 year olds, All Age Craft and All Age Activity Games.

After morning coffee, when adults are in their workshops, there will be theme related children's workshops as follows: *Sparks* (ages 0-4), *Flames* (Reception/Years 1-4), and Lasers (Year 5 upwards)

### Messy Craft (Sunday) – Gaye Rees (Co-ordinator)

Following last year's success, the idea of Messy Church is returning to Holiday Forum this year with a session based on the story of Abraham which fits into the theme of *Follow my Leader* based on Genesis 12.21. It's for <u>all ages and abilities</u> and is a way of engaging everyone in understanding the Bible through craft and activities. When we follow a story and then combine it with crafts or activities it helps us to remember the story and cement it in our minds. We'll start with a short video that tells the story, and maybe a song, and then we'll share in some exciting activities, so please come along, and find out, as even a story you thought you knew well often has a new slant or angle that brings it even more alive.

Feel free to take part or just watch and listen, as you please.

### Fishers of Men (Monday – 2:00pm (building) & 7:45pm (racing)) – Angela & Richard Storer

Following the success of *Horsing Around* last year, this year Forum is having its very own Regatta! Instead of racing horses, we'll be racing boats (steered by Jesus) as this ties in with the theme of *Fishers of men*! The format otherwise is exactly the same - in two sessions. **This is for <u>all ages</u> to join in with**. Participation isn't compulsory, but it's not too active either if you want to give it a try.

The first (afternoon) session is to design and 'build' the boats in teams... so bring your creative flair! The second (evening) session (on the same day) is 'Regatta Day' and here we need a crowd to cheer as well as people to race the boats. The workshop has in the past been open to children, but I'm happy to accommodate a group of adults too. Nothing makes you feel young like singing and dancing with your friends!

Hymns with a touch of the theme will be considered first and, if, as in the past, there are too many to fit in the allotted time, please let me know which verses you'd prefer to concentrate on. There will be space for the choice of younger people too. **This is an <u>all age gathering</u>.**

Jesus-shaped Church

- mission and discipleship versus survivalism -

After 2100 years of Christian history, Jesus has lost none of his chic or credibility. The church that claims his name, by contrast, is viewed actively as Bad News. Churches would be overflowing and among the most widely respected and valued institutions in our society if they were recognisably like Jesus. Instead, we're hovering on the edge of extinction, because people are aware of the contradiction and aren't prepared to be part of the whole church project. When you stop and think about it, it's strange that we don't define churches as 'communities of people that act like Jesus', isn't it? If people looked at Jesus and saw what God was like, it should surely be the case that people look at churches and individual Christians to see what Jesus is like? Something went badly wrong somewhere in Christian history. If we're going to be faithful disciples of Jesus, making a Jesus-shaped difference to our communities and being part of the Good News we proclaim, we need to start following Jesus more closely and more faithfully. That means letting go of our obsession with survival and success, and rediscovering what discipleship and mission are all about instead. Jesus called it, 'denying ourselves, taking up our cross, and following - losing our lives in order to find them!' It's risky and it's scary, but it is also being where Jesus is, and there is no other way to find life in all its fullness! Are you up for the journey?

- Address: The Hayes Conference Centre, Hayes Lane, Swanwick, Derbyshire, DE55 1AU
- **By road:** The Hayes is 5 miles from Junction 28 of the M1. From Junction 28, take the A38 towards Derby. Leave at the marked exit for A615 Matlock/A61 Chesterfield and take the B6179 towards Swanwick/ Ripley. At the traffic lights by the church in Swanwick turn left towards Somercotes (B6016). After 500 yards turn right into Hayes Lane. The Conference Centre is straight ahead. There is plenty of free parking.
- By train: The local railway station is Alfreton on the Sheffield-Nottingham line, but trains are limited. It is about 3 miles from The Hayes. Taxis are available. Alternatively, from Derby Station, catch a bus or taxi (approx. 15 miles).
